2. OPENING

- B. INNOVATION WEEK DURATION: The duration for the innovation week is five (5) days in November; Monday-Friday. Monday marks the opening ceremony, with selected activities including Keynote address, exhibitions, etc. Friday marks the closing ceremony, with distinctive awards.

- C. FACULTY COMPETITION: There should be Inter-Faculty presentation/competition on INNOVATION SKILLS AND INNOVATIVE RESEARCH. The best presentation has an
- D. PRIZES AND AWARDS: There should be an Instituted Prize for Innovation, and other awards should be encouraged. The centres of excellence ACE-CEFOR and ACE-PUTOR as well as Industry partners should be approached for some prizes and awards.
- E. RESEARCH EXHIBITIONS/RECOGNITION OF RESEARCH ICONS: There should be Faculty research exhibitions as well as the recognition of research outputs/icons.
- F. RESOURCE PERSONS AND FACILITATORS: Resource persons and facilitators to be invited to make presentations in line with the Innovation Week theme; and should be beneficial to people in Science, Arts, Humanities and all works of life.
- G. STUDENT CORNER: Students' skills on innovation to be showcased as student inter-
- H. CHALLENGES ON INNOVATION: Faculties to discuss challenges they are faced with on the subject of Innovation. This will mark inter-faculty discussion forum.
- I. DAILY ACTIVITIES: Each day of the Innovation Week should mark some special activities and should attract facilitators that drive the sub-theme for the day.
- J. THE INNOVATION WEEK FRAMEWORK: Prof. Patrick-Inwanyanwu and Mr. Uduma to harmonize the Innovation Week Framework from ACE-CEFOR and ACE-PUTOR submissions and report in the next meeting of the committee.

2. MEETING AGENDUM: 2023 Innovation Week

3. OPENING

The meeting started at about 2:09 pm with an opening prayer said by Dr. Zelda Imosanuwa, Associate Dean, Faculty of Agriculture. The Innovation Committee Chairman, Prof. Siminialayi, in his opening

remarks, welcomed all attendees to the meeting and seized the opportunity to briefly remind the Provost and Deans about the Regional Strategy for Regional students, a means of recruiting more regional (foreign) students into the postgraduate programmes of the School of Graduate Studies and specialized Centres of the University. He particularly requested their urgent feedback to enhance the needed actions.

On the meeting agendum, the Chairman briefed the Provost and Deans about the 2023 Innovation Week of the University scheduled to hold October 23-27, 2023. As a way of kick-starting the meeting, he introduced the members of the University Innovation Committee and emphasized that Innovation Week is an annual university programme and requires the involvement of all faculties, hence the need for the input of the Provost and Deans toward the success of the Innovation Week.

He informed the attendees that Innovation is a topical issue in universities around the world and cannot be underemphasized. He emphasized that although we have been doing research for centuries but some of the research do not impact our immediate community and environment. He stated that with innovation week activities, researchers would be well sensitized on the need and value of innovation. Furthermore, people who have brilliant ideas can highlight such ideas while encouraging others to do impactful research.

4. PROGRAMME OF ACTIVITES

He presented the tentative programme of events, scheduled for the five days of the innovation week, and the plan to invite Prof. Oyewole Olusola, the Secretary General of the Association of African Universities, Accra Ghana, to deliver the Keynote Address during the opening ceremony. He observed that Graduate School was not listed for the presentation. He considered that as a big omission emphasizing that it is important for the Dean of the Graduate School to make a presentation on challenges facing graduate students, quality research, and policies. After due consideration, the Graduate School was allocated to make a presentation on Day 1 of the programme between 10:45 am and 11:15 am, immediately after the Roundtable discussion. A few suggestions were made on the Faculty presentation schedule. (See the attached TENTATIVE PROGRAMME OF EVENTS/AGENDA for other details).

The Chairman invited the attendees to address some burning concerns about Innovation. These include;

- iv. Are there Faculty members (lecturers) we should add to this program who would in turn add value to innovation week?

The Chairman requested to hear from the deans of faculties what innovation entailed in their academic disciplines.

2.0.2 OPENING REMARK

The Chairman of the Committee and the DVC R&D, Prof. I. M. Siminialayi, welcomed all the Faculty representatives for the 2023 Expanded Innovation Committee and then went ahead to ask each of the representatives to tell the committee how they are preparing for the exhibition and innovation.

2.0.3. UPDATES

- First to call up was the Director of ODel Center Prof. Baridam B. B. He said with what they have at the moment the center can accommodate students in thousands from both outside Rivers State and the country on their distance learning platform. He also said that they have what is called PDM which is a mode of learning that is of a good innovation and that can reach a larger audience.
