The story of Apostle Tamuno-Ojuemi Humphrey Ogaji began ninety-one years ago, on November 25, 1934- a date that marked the arrival of a life destined to touch countless others. He was born into the family of Late Chief Nawariboko Ogaji Agina Benebo and Late Mrs. Lydia Nwanyi-Ocha Ogaji in Ke Town, Degema Local Government Area, Rivers State, Nigeria. Out of their eleven children, only he and his elder sister, Late Madam Skyn Ogaji Agina, survived into adulthood.

Ke, his hometown, is the oldest Kalabari settlement in the Eastern Niger Delta and is often called the "Mother Settlement" of the Ijo people. Growing up in this historic coastal community shaped his identity, discipline, and deep pride in his cultural heritage -values that guided him throughout his life.

He began his education at St. John's School, Ke, continued at St. Michael's School, Buguma, and later attended Kalabari National College, Buguma (1952–1956). His quest for knowledge took him to St. John's College, Diobu, where he earned his teacher training certificate. He later obtained a B.A. in Economics from Durham University (via Fourah Bay College, Sierra Leone) and a master's degree in economics and education from Temple University, Philadelphia, USA, with further studies at Aston University, Birmingham, UK.

Papa's professional career spanned over 35 years of exemplary public service in the Nigerian education

sector. He served as teacher, principal, inspector, and director of education across various states including then Bendel (current Delta state and Edo state), and Rivers (current Rivers state & Bayelsa state) without any blemish as he never received any query throughout his career, a remarkable testament to his integrity and dedication.

Beyond education, Apostle Ogaji answered a higher calling. He was ordained in the Church of God Mission, Benin City, and later founded and pastored several branches across Nigeria. His ministry was marked by fervent prayer, humility, and unwavering faith. In 1986, he was ordained by the Holy Spirit as an Apostle of Jesus Christ—a title he cherished for life. He further undertook the

Holy Pilgrimage to Jerusalem. As Founder and General Overseer of Jesus Power Evangelistic Ministries International, his ministry touched many through healings, salvations, and lasting spiritual transformation.

A passionate teacher and prolific writer, Apostle Ogaji authored numerous academic and spiritual works, including 101 Questions & Answers on Economics, Standard Objective Tests on Economics and Commerce, Basic English for Senior Secondary Schools, The Kings of Israel and Judah, The Deadly Sins, and The Great Commission. His writings continue to enlighten students, teachers, and believers.

Family was his greatest joy. He was first married to Mrs. Victoria Ogaji, his devoted companion and prayer partner, with whom he spent 13 years before her passing in 1980—a loss he felt deeply. In 1984, he married Mrs. Cordelia Onyinyechi Ogaji. Papa was blessed with nine children (six sons and three daughters), thirty grandchildren, and many extended family members whom he lovingly nurtured.

Papa lived by unwavering principles: faith, integrity, discipline, compassion, and hard work. He was a teacher to students, a pastor to his family, a prayer warrior for his community, a worshipper before God, and a committed institution-builder—fondly called Mr. Project.

He was fearless in truth, generous in spirit, and steadfast in faith. His influence continues to shape the lives of all who knew him.

Apostle Tamuno-Ojuemi Humphrey Ogaji fought the good fight, finished his course, and kept the faith. His memory remains a blessing, and his legacy a guiding light for generations.

FAMILY TREE OF LATE APOSTLE TAMUNO-OJUEMI HUMPHREY OGAJI

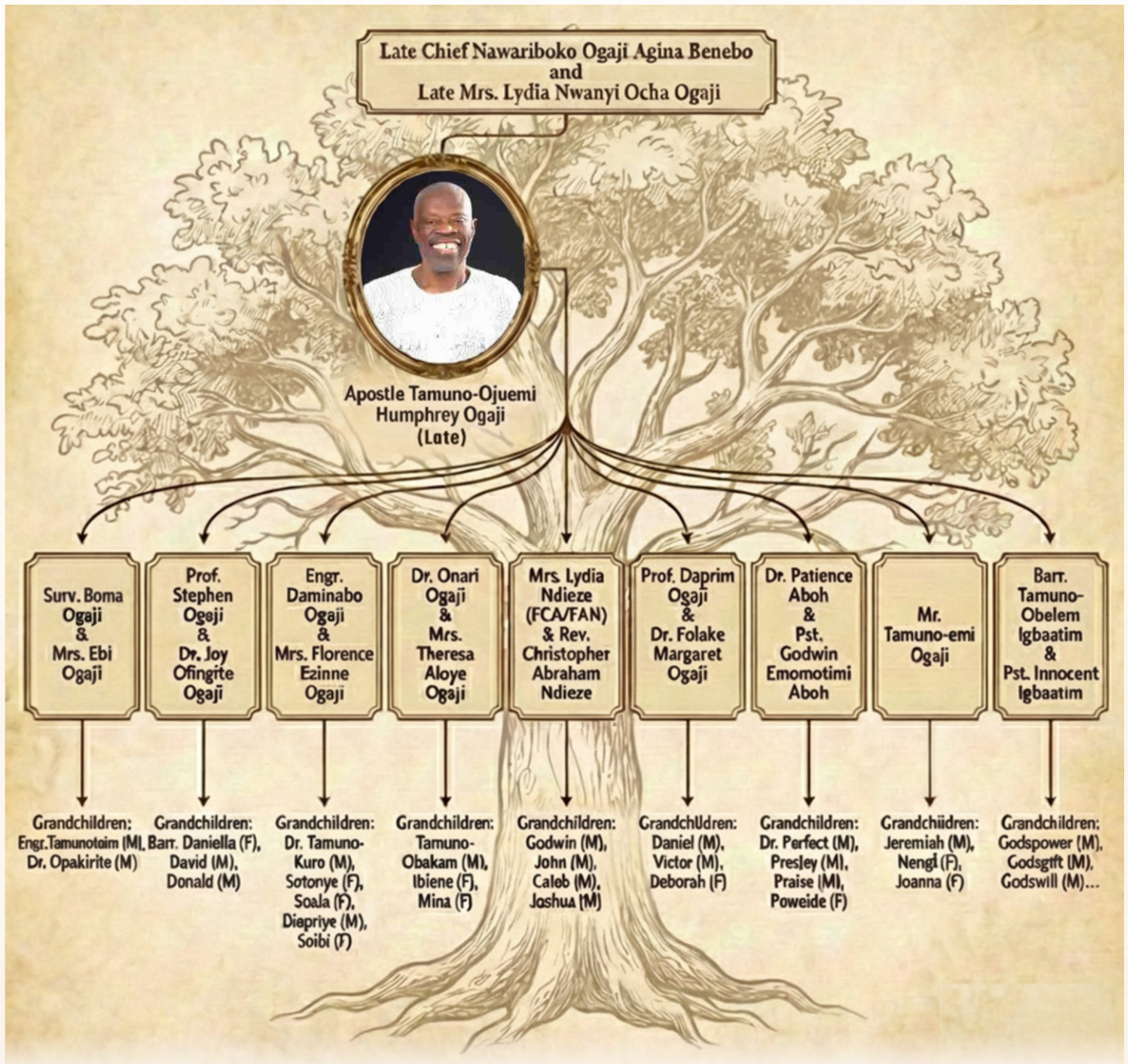

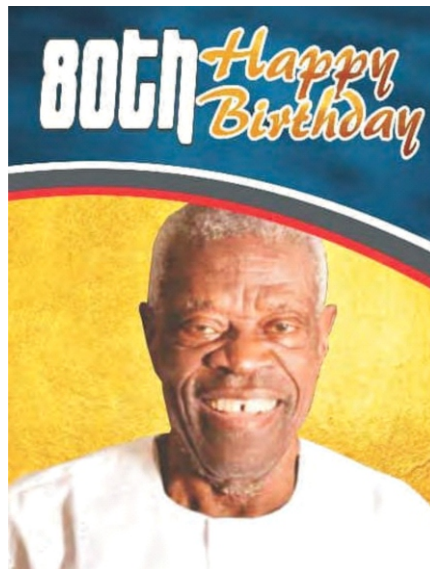

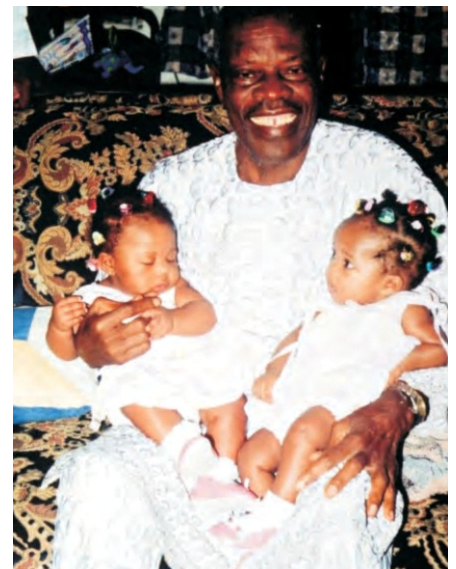

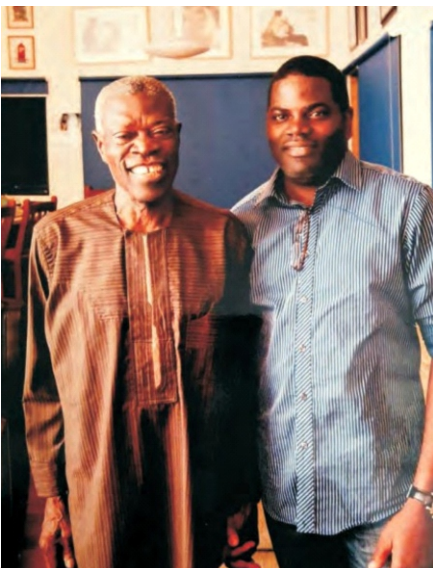
